Adventist Book Center

Many people visit our ABC, some seeking Adventist materials, others exploring health products. In our vegetarian section, we promote a plant-based lifestyle, which often sparks interest in our faith. These moments allow us to share God's love, whether through music or a *Steps to Christ* book. Our goal is for customers to leave with a little bit of our faith. Despite challenges in sales over the last five years, our members remain interested in purchasing vegetarian food, and we have kept the ABC open. Camp Cedar Falls

Camp Cedar Falls (CCF) is a space for our members to encounter God in nature. Many lives have been touched through summer camps, youth events, and evangelism—that's why we have kept the camp running all these years and provided support during times it was without income. After a 16-month closure due to COVID, groups are now returning. In 2022, CCF management shifted from Youth Ministries to the Treasury Department to help focus on youth programs. This is a center of evangelism, and we remain committed to providing a space to foster spiritual growth for all generations.



Korean Adventist Press

The Korean Adventist Press (KAP), located in Los Angeles, publishes three monthly magazines—*Church Compass*, *Signs of the Times*, and *Home and Health*—that are distributed to 130 Korean congregations across the U.S. and Canada. KAP's ministry is also expressed in their storefront, which is similar to an Adventist Book Center, where they sell Spirit of Prophecy books and other Adventist literature, along with healthy food. During the pandemic, physical communication declined, but KAP's print materials became a crucial way to reach people effectively.
