4. ROLE OF THE CHAIR

Robert's Rules of Order

GC Rules of Order

- The chairperson's role also involves spiritual leadership, guiding the meeting procedurally, and emphasizing unity and mission alignment.

5. VOTING PROCEDURES

Robert's Rules of Order

- Provides detailed instructions on various voting methods, including voice vote, roll call vote, and ballot vote.
- It also covers handling tie votes, abstentions, and other complexities.

GC Rules of Order

- Voting procedures are simpler and may be adapted to the context of the meeting, reflecting the church's emphasis on unity and collective decision-making.
- There is also a stronger emphasis on reaching consensus rather than merely counting votes.

GC Rules of Order

8. SPIRITUAL INTEGRATION

Robert's Rules of Order

- It is a secular document that focuses on the mechanics of meeting procedures without integrating religious or spiritual elements.

GC Rules of Order

- Integrates spiritual principles throughout the meeting procedures, including prayer, Bible readings, and considerations of the church's mission and values in decision-making.
